"The Infinite Library, Old Worlds and New: Manuscripts, Archives and Special Collections in the 21st Century," is an international symposium on the future of the library. It will bring together leading authors, publishers, librarians, university administrators, national policy shapers, representatives of leading foundations, and experts in information technology to discuss key issues facing humanities research and special collections in the new century.

HARRY RANSOM HUMANITIES RESEARCH CENTER

Considered one of the world's finest cultural archives, the Harry Ransom Humanities Research Center at The University of Texas at Austin houses rare books, literary manuscripts, photography and film collections, theater collections, and visual arts collections. Its world-renowned manuscript collections contain over thirty million documents and feature such prominent authors as James Joyce, Anne Sexton, Samuel Beckett, Tom Stoppard and Isaac Bashevis Singer. The library contains over one million volumes of rare books and first editions. The Center's photography collection consists of over five million prints and negatives and includes significant holdings by such noted photographers as Edward Steichen, Ansel Adams, David Douglas Duncan and Sir Cecil Beaton. Outstanding film, theater and visual arts materials include the archive of David O. Selznick, the theatrical designs of Leon Bakst and Norman Bel Geddes, and major works by Frida Kahlo and Diego Rivera. Committed to making its treasures widely accessible, the Ransom Center presents exhibitions featuring a wide variety of collections and offers annual fellowships for scholarly research. The Center and its exhibitions are open to the public.

THE FLEUR COWLES FLAIR SYMPOSIUM

Initiated in 1994, the *Flair* Symposium is held biennially at the Ransom Center, and was established to honor Fleur Cowles and the ideals set forth in her landmark publication, *Flair* magazine. Like *Flair*, the symposium seeks to pull together the new, the controversial, the innovative and the creative.






LODGING

A limited number of rooms have been reserved for conference attendees at the Doubletree Guest Suites Hotel, 303 West 15th Street, for Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights, November 2, 3 and 4, 2000.
